



Today we had one additional resident on the first floor skilled nursing test positive for the virus.

We continue to be inspired by all the notes of encouragement, the prayers and importantly, family members expressions of gratitude to our staff who are so valiantly working in the trenches with this. The support shown by all of you is a testament to the "family" of the Village's associates, residents and family who have come together during this time. Your patience and understanding of the extraordinary efforts being taken to prevent the spread of the virus are appreciated.

Confirmed Cases Today:

Resident Case #1:

This resident (resident #1) was admitted to the first floor skilled nursing unit on 3/28/2020. They had completed a required 14-day quarantine upon admission without exhibiting any symptoms of virus and were moved in with a roommate who had also completed a quarantine without exhibiting symptoms. The roommate (resident #2) developed symptoms on 5/4/2020 and the two residents, at that time, were moved to private rooms and each was placed in isolation and tested for COVID-19. The roommate's (resident #2) test results were reported as positive on 5/6/2020. Today, resident #1 test results yielded a positive result for the virus. Resident #1 remains at the Village at Victory Lakes and, at present, remains stable and in isolation.

Based upon the recommendations received from the health department we are cohorting the positives and cohorting the negatives separately on the unit involved.

Important to note: We continue to have a FULL supply of PPE for all staff, meaning masks, face shields, gowns and gloves are available for all staff that have direct contact with residents who are positive or in isolation. As mandated by the state and local health departments and the CDC, the most important aspect during this crisis is to monitor everyone closely and treat for symptoms. Additionally, ALL of the infection prevention measures mentioned in previous memos remains in place.

Containment Procedures:

Residents continue to be monitored closely for the earliest signs or symptoms of COVID-19. **If any signs or symptoms develop, a resident is immediately isolated.** Associates continue to be screened daily when they report for work; if any screening element is noted to be abnormal, the associate is sent home.

Precautionary Measures:

Our Infection Preventionist, along with our Head of Clinical and Infectious Disease Control are widening the visitor screening procedures, adding additional screening items to the list of current symptoms that we have been screening for. The skilled nursing unit has limited access to only staff assigned to that unit with no visitors allowed. The Village at Victory Lakes continues to restrict visitors and monitors those associates and residents, following CDC-regulated standards for infection control and to prevent any spread of the virus. The staff continues to maintain proper PPE recommendations and protocol, as defined by the local and state health departments and the CDC.

We understand that this is a time of anxiety and unknowns for the safety of you or loved ones. 100% of our efforts are geared towards the safety of your loved ones.
